		<u>Gross Anatomy</u> – Rated PG-13 (for subject matter and language). This is a story of a brilliant 1 st year medical student whose casual approach to life gets tested during his Gross Anatomy class. The movie follows the funny, and some not-so-funny moments of this medical student's initiation into the field of medicine.
		<u>Osmosis Jones</u> – Rated PG (for subject matter). This is an animated adventure of Osmosis Jones, a white blood cell in the human body. This movie is filled with humor, but does an excellent job of explaining the process of how the body fights off an infection. Different animated characters portray different types of cells and body organs and how they are affected during different stages of an infection.
